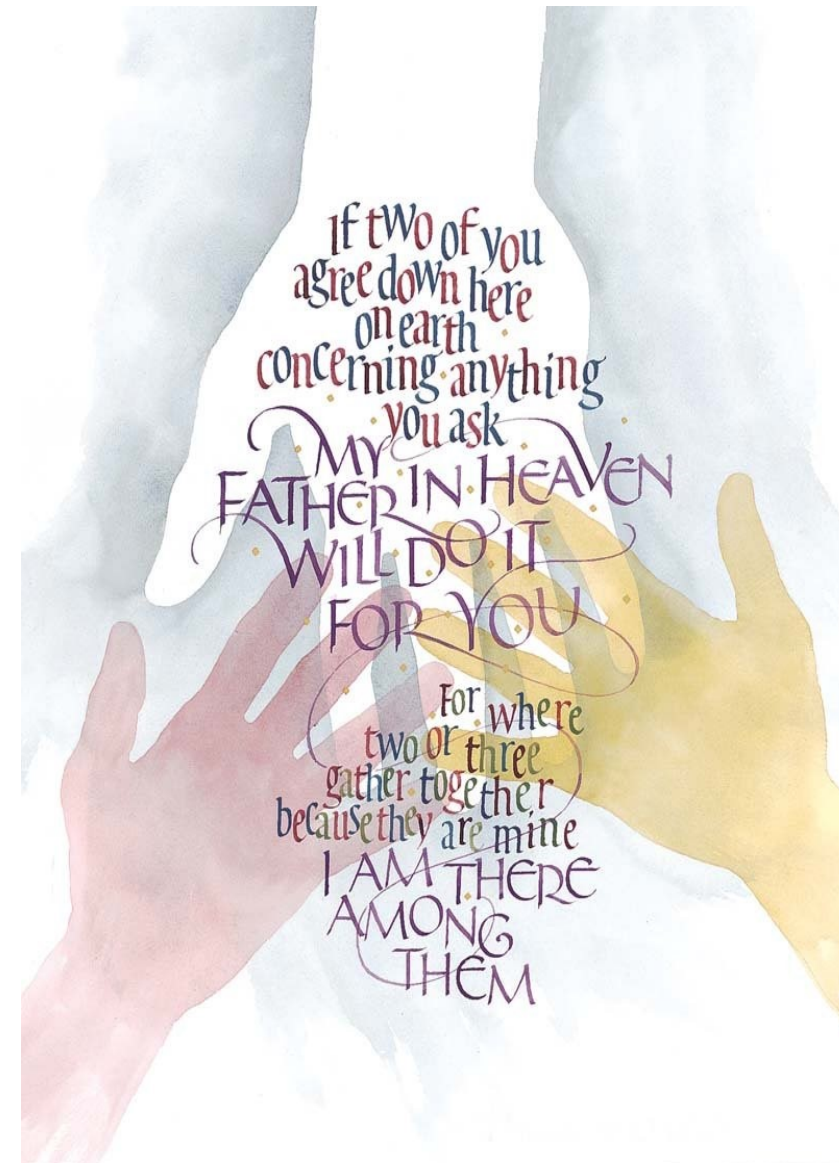

¹⁵“If your brother or sister sins against you, go and correct them when you are alone together. If they listen to you, then you’ve won over your brother or sister. ¹⁶But if they won’t listen, take with you one or two others so that *every word may be established by the mouth of two or three witnesses.* ¹⁷But if they still won’t pay attention, report it to the church. If they won’t pay attention even to the church, treat them as you would a Gentile and tax collector. ¹⁸I assure you that whatever you fasten on earth will be fastened in heaven. And whatever you loosen on earth will be loosened in heaven. ¹⁹Again I assure you that if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, then my Father who is in heaven will do it for you. ²⁰For where two or three are gathered in my name, I’m there with them.”



We will be worshipping on the lawn beginning September 13th at 10:00 AM. It will be warm - Georgia September is not my idea of ideal weather. To that end, dress as informally as you'd like within reason. We will supply water bottles, but please bring any of your own water that you might want to bring for yourself. Further, if you have one, bring your own chair. It will help us to cut down on the time spent on sanitation after the service. We can provide some chairs if you don't bring your own. If we have inclement weather, please join our online worship.

In accordance with the best practices related to how we understand COVID-19, **we will maintain a social distance of at least 6 feet.** There will be masks provided for those who do not have any. Please bring your own if you have one and wear it. I know we're worshipping outside, which helps mitigate some of the risk of spread, but our best understanding of this disease is that masks can help prevent its transmission. There will also be plenty of hand sanitizer, and combined with masks, social distance, and being outdoors, I think this is the safest way possible for us to be together.
